





# As We Close Another Year, Year-end Giving Takes New Meaning in Meeting Needs

It is common that church members ask for year-end giving suggestions. With tax laws being what they are and required minimum distributions a fact of life, we sometimes can avoid paying tax by making charitable contributions.

At the church, our greatest area of need is always the general fund. While not necessarily exciting, our general fund pays for the day-to-day operations of the church — each day costing about \$2,600.

Our Legacy Funds are an excellent giving opportunity. These are our permanently (unless instructed otherwise by the giver) endowed funds. Four percent (4%) of those endowed funds flow into such church ministries each year as music, special children's programs, events, and building expenses. While people often only think of Legacy as an "end of life" gift, giving to these funds at any time is helpful and welcome.

Our missions beyond the church are also a great opportunity to make a difference in Prescott and beyond. (Literature about our missions is available in the Narthex).

# Koinonia Compares Catholic Saints During Weekly Study in New Year


n Jan. 4, 2026, the Koinonia class will begin a study of sainthood. Our primary resource will be the book

# **UWF Showcases Agape House, Transitions Homeless Families**

nited Women in Faith (UWF), at its November meeting, was blessed to have speakers from Agape House, both Prescott and Prescott Valley.

This organization gives homes to families experiencing homelessness. Agape House "walks with these families" from beginning to their new lives, according to Becky Mitchell, Agape House executive director, who told us so many wonderful and heart-warming

stories about the individual housing they have procured for homeless families in Prescott Valley and apartment-type housing for homeless singles in Prescott.

When a family comes to them and needs housing as they are living in their car or out in the woods Becky and

her staff of volunteers put together an entire household with sheets, pillows, blankets, bedspreads and towels plus kitchen items: dishes, stainless eating utensils, pots & pans coffee pot, toaster kitchen towels everything needed by a family including a washer & dryer!

Agape House volunteer Cynthia shared stories of how their "families" overcame their individual obstacles. She shared how the program sets up the trailers for each new family. During their six-months with Agape, they're trained in job interviews, family counseling, bible study, family budgets and many other requisite skills that the family needs for success.


Neighborhood Coordinators provide you with a free bag to fill. Every even month on the second Saturday, put the filled bag on your porch; it will be collected and you will receive a fresh bag. All food is unloaded at central collection spots where it is distributed to Quad City area food banks and schools.

In October 40,440 pounds of non-perishable food was collected and distributed! With this steady source of food, it helps food banks to plan more efficiently and creates a kinder, stronger community.

If you are unable to participate, PUMC will still have a box in the back of the Sanctuary for non-perishable food for The Community Cupboard which is the fiscal agent for YFNP.




We accept all the cookies you have time to bake as we hope to break our 2024 record in cookie sales (\$3,500) since there are so many community groups we'd like to help with funds!

If you spend at least \$15, you can get a free gift bag and we will even put it together for you! Choose from coffee, tea, or chocolate products. We will soon have dark chocolate chips (70%) to make your Christmas treats healthier.

The Equal Exchange cooperative, an interfaith model, eliminates the middle man, so that they can give a fair price to the struggling farmers.

All crops are grown sustainably. It al-

lows small farmers to stay in their villages and use their sustainable farming skills. Because they do not have to compete directly against large corporate interests, their profits allow



Ten percent of profits go to the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR), as well as \$.15 for each pound of products sold. At PUMC, we sell all products at our cost, as the purpose is to have earnings go to the farmers. Not a bad bargain for delicious coffee, chocolate and other products.
